To understand how working together can benefit your child, it is first important to understand our district's and school's goals for student academic achievement.

Hall County School System Goals:

By the end of FY22, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.

By the end of FY23 (with FY22 being the baseline year), the percentage of students in each subgroup meeting "Proficient" levels of performance on local assessments (Elementary - MAP/Beacon, Middle/High - Common Benchmark Assessments) will increase by 2%.

Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services by 2% each year (with FY21 being the baseline year).

Martin Technology Academy School Improvement Goals 2021-2022:

During the 2021-22 school year, increase by 3% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in grades 3-5 as measured by the EOG Milestones (Lexile scores).

During the 2021-22 school year, increase by 3% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in grades 3-5 as measured by the Math EOG Milestones.

During the 2021-22 school year, increase by 3% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in grades 3-5 as measured by the Writing Domain on the EOG Milestones.

School/Teacher Responsibilities:

- 1. Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards by:**
 - Provide parents with information and an explanation of how to access Hall County's Big Ideas parent resources (accessible in English and Spanish) that include instructional videos and questions for parents to ask their child to check reading and math fluency



- Provide books for students to take home to read, as well as share eBooks and digital literacy resources with parents to practice reading with their child at home and increase their vocabulary
- Participate in Student Led/Parent Conference Day

Parent Responsibilities:

As a parent, I will:

- Visit the Hall County's Big Ideas website utilizing parent resources (accessible in English and Spanish) that include instructional videos and questions to ask my child in an effort to check reading and math fluency
- Log-in to Canvas to check my child's work and contact the teacher if there are topics we do not understand
- Read at least 20 minutes with my child and discuss the book with my child to ensure understanding and comprehension
- Keep up with my child's progress by attending conferences and parent meetings, talking with teachers, looking at school work, checking daily communication, and report card

Student Responsibilities:

As a student, I will:

- Check out books from Media Center and read every day at home and at school
- Practice my math fluency at least three times a week for 10 minutes
- Use the Canvas course my teachers share with me to complete my assignments and practice activities

Communication about Student Learning:

Martin Technology Academy is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

- All teachers will communicate with parents with a newsletter
- All teachers will communicate with parents through the Monday folders with information regarding what is happening in the classroom.
- Parents may set up meetings with their child's teacher or the administration to discuss their child's progress.
- All students will receive report cards every 9 weeks throughout the school year
- Individual teachers and grade levels will use additional tools, such as Remind to frequently communicate student progress to parents.
- 3rd – 5th grade students' grades are available 24/7 to parents on the Infinite Campus Parent Portal.
- Teachers are required to communicate via either email, phone, text message, written notes, newsletters, etc. every month with families.
