What is Title I?

Martin Technology Academy is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Martin Technology Academy of Math and Science will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. How is it revised?

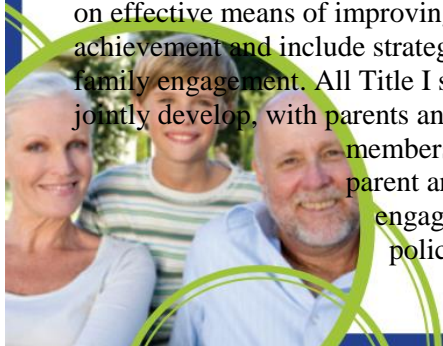
Martin Technology Academy invited all parents to attend our annual Parent and Family Input Meeting in the spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, school comprehensive needs assessment, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and to submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Martin Technology Academy will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

After the plan is revised each fall, a link to the plan is distributed to all parents via Infinite Campus email and Remind101. The plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a printed copy of the plan in the Parent Information Center in the lobby of the school.



2022 - 2023 District Goals

By the end of FY23, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance.

Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services by 2% each year (with FY21 being the baseline year) to decrease the number of OSS days in grades 6-12.

2022-2023 School Goals

During the 2022-23 school year, increase by 3% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in grades 3-5 as measured by the EOG Milestones (Lexile scores).

During the 2022-23 school year, increase by 3% the number of students performing at or above proficiency in grades 3-5 as measured by the Math EOG Milestones.

During the 2022-23 school year, decrease by 3% the number of students chronically absent in grades K-5.

During the 2022-23 school year, 100% of students will be able to name a trusted adult by the end of the school year.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Martin Technology Academy and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students and teachers during the Title I Parent and Family Input Meeting. The school- parent compacts are kept in the main office if parents need a copy.

A celebration of reading that engages families. There will be virtual events offered for families to participate.

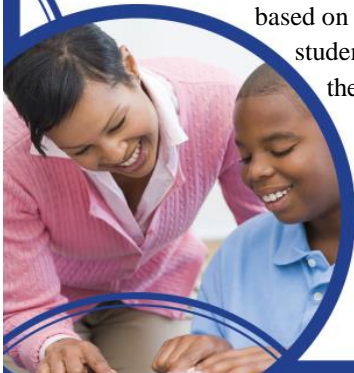
EOG Informational Meeting – April 12th, 2023

Keeping Parents Informed

Martin Technology Academy will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will take the following actions:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities will be communicated to parents in both English and Spanish.
- ✓ Survey parents annually to share their perceptions of the school and suggestions for improvement.
- ✓ Inform parents of school news, reports, and other items of interest through school-wide emails, phone calls, social media, and written communication.
- ✓ Maintain contact with our parents through the use of student agendas, newsletters, Infinite Campus and work folders. Parents are also encouraged to use email to ask questions and inform the teacher of things that may be beneficial to your child's education.
- ✓ Maintain an updated web site with parent information including newsletters, Title I Plan, Parent and Family Engagement Policy, School Improvement Plan, photo galleries, teacher web pages, and calendar of events, lunch menus, and helpful links for parents and students in both English and Spanish.
- ✓ Partner with Head Start through the District Parent Outreach Facilitator. The District Parent Outreach Facilitator meets with parents and families providing information and resources to support school orientation for parents, families and students to assist in successful student transitions to kindergarten.
- ✓ Canvas professional development modules are used, at least four times a year, to train school personnel about strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement.
- ✓ Provide parents with family meetings to share understandable information, strategies, and materials to be utilized at home to help students master grade-level standards and achieve personal and schoolwide goals. ** At this time, all parent meetings will be held virtually due to COVID-19 protocols. - ✓ Partner with middle schools to provide students and parents resources and information pertaining to successful transitioning to middle school.
